Masonic Connection


- Was steadfast in his beliefs

 - Believe to be aligned with Pagan holidays to make them more easily Christianized.



Biography

- Parents were Zebedee and Salome
- Younger brother to James
 - Known as the Sons of Thunder
- Thought to be the youngest of the Apostles
- Was mending nets in their boat, was called by Jesus and immediately followed him, leaving behind their father.

- Acts 4:13 classifies him as an uneducated man
- Was the closest of the Apostles "Beloved"
- Was at the Transfiguration (Moses and Elijah)
 - Get up and do not be afraid
 - Ordered not to tell anyone of what he saw
- Was at the Garden of Gethsemane
- Leaned on Jesus during the Last Supper rather than laying on the couches



Biography

- Was the crucifixion
- Was told to take care of Mary, Jesus' \bullet mother
- Was the first Apostle at the tomb
- Recognized Jesus after the ascension
 - Cast your nets to the rest side of the boat
- Was banished to the island of Patmos ightarrowwhere he died in 100 A.D.
- Patron Saint of Love, Loyalty, Friendship, and Authors

- Was considered uneducated
 - Not the external but internal qualifications
- Credited with writing 5 books of the Bible \bullet
 - Moving from the rough ashlar to the perfect ashlar
- Leaned on Jesus at the Last Supper
 - Brotherly Love


Masonic Connection
